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INTRODUCTION & METHODOLOGY

Riley Research Associates conducted an omnibus survey among likely Oregon voters regarding their opinions on a variety of current issues. The scientific telephone poll was conducted among 406 randomly selected registered likely voters throughout Oregon. A sample of 406 provides accuracy to within +/-4.86 percent at a 95 percent level of confidence. Fielding took place between August 10th and 15th, 2007.

This poll defined “likely voters” as those who have voted in at least two of the following four elections: 2004 General, 2004 Primary, 2006 General, or 2006 Primary. In addition, those who voted *only* in the 2006 General election were also included. The presidential question also shows results from our previous poll: [Riley Report - March 2007](#). Regional breakouts were defined for cross-tabulations. The counties were classified into the following regions:

- Portland Metro: Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, Washington
- Willamette Valley: Benton, Lane, Linn, Marion, Polk, Yamhill
- Southern: Douglas, Jackson, Josephine
- Central / Eastern: Baker, Crook, Deschutes, Gilliam, Grant, Harney, Hood River, Jefferson, Klamath, Lake, Malheur, Morrow, Sherman, Umatilla, Union, Wasco, Wallowa, Wheeler
- Coast: Clatsop, Coos, Curry, Lincoln, Tillamook


An executive overview has been provided, followed by cross-tabulations (banner-style), displaying the exact questions asked, along with demographic breakouts for each question.

RESULTS

Presidential Race

-  Oregon Democrats were asked which presidential candidate they would most likely support, from a list of candidates (see the cross tabs for the full list). Hillary Rodham Clinton was the front-runner with 26 percent, followed by Barack Obama with 18 percent and John Edwards at 17 percent. John Edwards has surged in the state, with an increase of 9 percent over our March 2007 poll. Edwards' increase has come largely at the expense of Clinton and Obama.

-  The race appears highly fluid among Oregon Republicans: Rudy Giuliani's numbers have fallen dramatically and he now appears tied with Mitt Romney (16 percent and 15 percent, respectively). Fred Thompson has moved up to third with 11 percent, while John McCain, has fallen from second to fourth with 8 percent of the votes. The percentage of undecided Republicans has actually increased to 35 percent since March.

US Senate Race

☒ We asked Oregon voters who they would vote for in a 3-way US Senate race. Republican Gordon Smith garnered the most support, with 38 percent, followed by Democrat Jeff Merkley at 19 percent, and Independent John Frohnmayr at 7 percent. One-third (35 percent) remained undecided, including 34 percent of Democrats as well as 47 percent of unaffiliated and other-party voters.

☒ While most Republicans support Smith (63 percent), many are undecided (31 percent). Merkley, who announced his candidacy a week before the poll on August 3rd, begins his campaign with the support of just 34 percent of Democrats. Many Democrats are also undecided (34 percent), but 21 percent currently favor Smith.

Legislative Ballot Measure 49

☒ Based on the ballot title, a majority of voters said they were likely to vote “Yes” on Ballot Measure 49 (the legislatively drafted land-use measure created to revise BM37); 58 percent supported the measure, while just 12 percent opposed it, and 30 percent were undecided.

☒ Among those most likely to support BM 49:

- Democrats (63 percent)
- Portland and Coastal regions (63 percent each)

Legislative Ballot Measure 50

☒ A majority of voters also indicated they were likely to vote “Yes” based on Measure 50 (the constitutional health coverage and tobacco tax measure), also referred by the legislature. Based on the ballot title, it would pass by a margin of 53 percent to 28 percent, with just 19 percent undecided.

☒ Among those most likely to support BM 50:

- Democrats (64 percent)
- Those age 50-59 (60 percent)
- Women (57 percent)
